# Y5/6 Boys Football Tournament

On Wednesday afternoon, Edward (year 5) and Seth (year 6) joined together with the boys from Egton School to make a team in the Y5/6 boys football tournament at Eskdale School in Whitby. They all played very well, showing great teamwork and finished runners up which was brilliant! Well done to Seth who scored an amazing goal and well done to both him and Edward who showed fantastic football skills throughout the tournament. Fabulous boys!

### Scarborough Castle Visit - Tuesday 4th October

On Tuesday, the whole school went on an educational visit to Scarborough Castle as part of their topic of 'Kings and Queen's'. It was an early start but everyone was very excited heading off on the coach! I asked 2 children from the infants and 2 from the juniors if they could recount what they had learnt. They were very animated about telling me and I would like to share this with you in their own words......

## Harvey and James - age 6

"The castle was built out of timber in the olden days but is now built out of bricks and the toilets were called 'Guardrobes'. Attackers who wanted to break into castles would dig a hole under the castle, put pigs in the hole, set fire to them and the walls would burn down. It was a very big castle and the windows were tall, flat at the bottom and curved at the top. The shields were made out of leather and wood. We went into the Kings Hall and held a goblet made out of

leather that they used to drink alcohol out of. There was a 'Buttery' where they used to make wine. It was called a Buttery because the barrels were called buttery barrels. One of the men dressed up as a Knight and had a helmet on with padding underneath. We did 3 smell tests and these were stinky poo, smoke and fire from the fireplace. There was a very deep well with salt water in it but we didn't go near it because it was dangerous and very deep!"

## Lota age 10 and Elfriede age 9

"The attackers threw rotten fish at the castle and if it fell into the well, it would kill the water supply and put bacteria in it. The toilets were a pit and they would send little boys, some as young as 5, to clean them out which was horrible. They did sometimes find money though and were allowed to keep it. The well is 47 metres deep! King John used to go to Scarborough Castle for his holidays and there is a King John Hall and a King John Chamber at the castle named after him. In the hall there is a Buttery where they used to make wine. It is called a Buttery because the barrels are called Butts. The soldiers used to wear the same aprons if they were fighting on the same side so that they knew not to fight against them. They used 2 different arrows, one called a 'Bodkin' and a 'Broadhead'. Scarborough Castle was captured for 3 days and then they got it back. It was ruined in WW1 when Scarborough Coast was bombed and the castle crumbled"

# Free School Meal Eligibility

If you think you may be entitled to free school meals for your child, please use the application form which can be found on the NYCC website -<u>Free school meals | North Yorkshire County Council.</u>

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and currently receives universal free school meals, please check your entitlement. Being eligible will mean that the school receives additional funding for your child which will go towards their learning and any additional support they may need.

To qualify for free school meals you must fulfil one of the following criteria:

- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods (£616.67 per month);
- Income Support;
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance;
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance;
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit;
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC);
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit. Please note that contributions-based benefits, including contribution-related Jobseekers' Allowance do not entitle you to claim free school meals.

### **Jewellery in School**

Please could we remind everyone of the policy regarding jewellery in school.

'Jewellery is not allowed to be worn for Health and Safety reasons following a directive from North Yorkshire County Council. However a watch and small stud earrings may be worn on a daily basis but must be removed for PE.'

We have noticed a number of children wearing items such as bracelets and necklaces recently. Not only does this present a health and safety risk but also causes upset if these items get lost.

If you wish your child to have their ears pierced, we recommend that you have this done over the Summer holiday period to allow them to heal before a return to school. All earrings must now be removed for PE and Swimming lessons, we are not allowed to tape over them as in previous times.
